



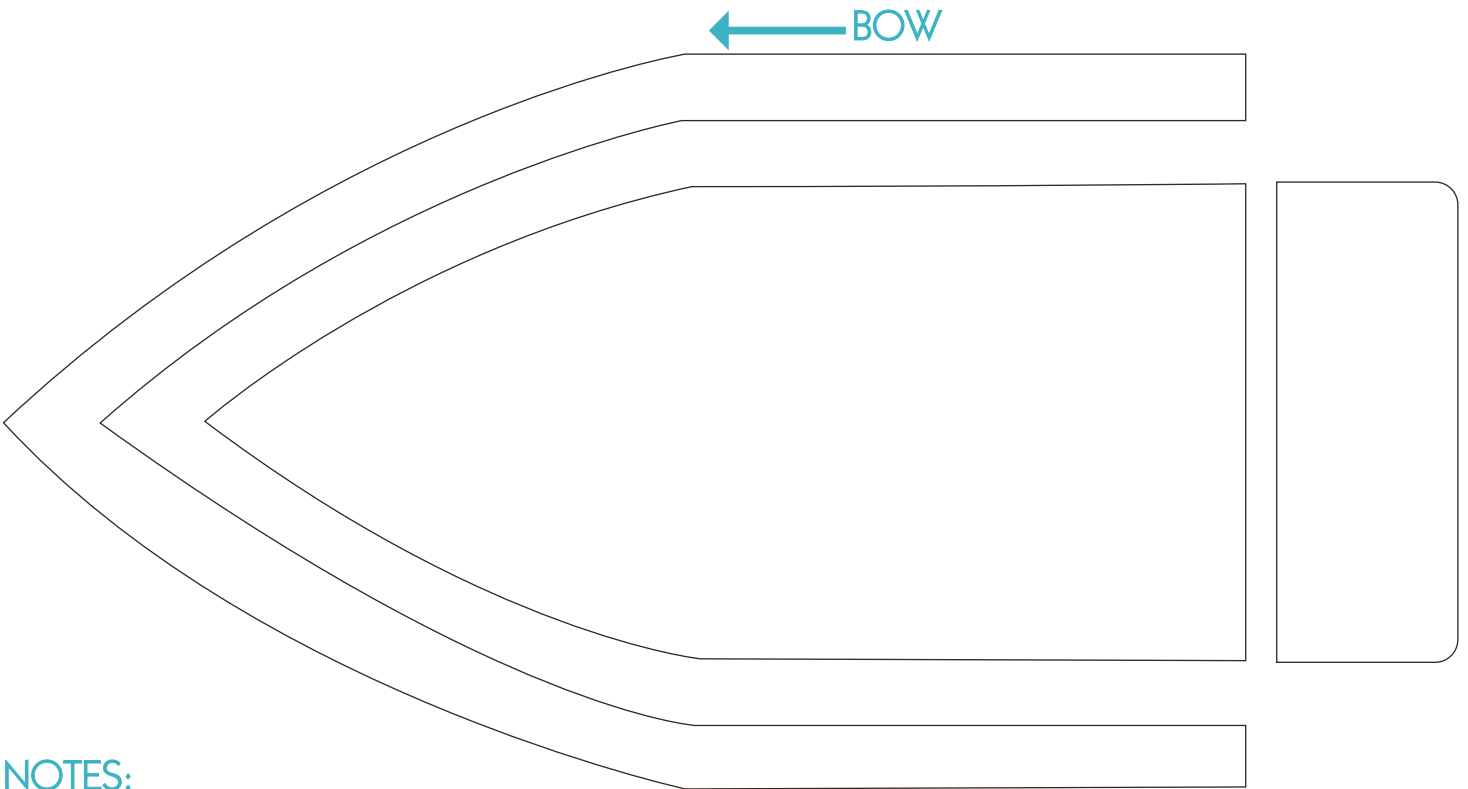

Template Instructions

STEP 1: Decide what areas of the deck you want to cover with MarineMat.

STEP 2: Cut the template material to the rough shape and size of each area to be covered. Note: Keep in mind that the largest piece of MarineMat cannot exceed 90"X44" without a seam.

STEP 3: Once your template material is cut, use the masking tape to hold it in place and pull it snug.

STEP 4: Using the marker, trace the outline of where you want the mats to fit. Make sure to align the borders of pieces that align with each other.

Note: It is advisable to keep the mats 1"-2" away from vertical walls, especially in tight corners. Where possible try to have the edge of the mats extend beyond the non-skid and onto the smooth part of the deck.

Around hinges, latches, seat bases, table bases, leaning posts, T-tops, access ports or other deck obstructions, make sure to leave at least 1/4" in clearance. However 1/2" is preferred. For all openings make sure to have the pattern recessed back from the edge at least 1/4".

Supplies

- Mylar, plastic or other see-through material
- Scissors
- Razor knife
- Masking tape
- Sharpie marker
- Tape measure
- Straight edge

STEP 5: MARKING THE TEMPLATE PIECES

- Mark the orientation of each piece indicating bow and stern.
- Using a straight edge, draw a line from each piece across to another and letter the lines A/A, B/B and so on. This is so the pieces can be aligned at the MarineMat factory. Make notes anywhere that is not perfectly clear how the mat looks because slight curves may be confused as straight lines by our scanners. Number each piece for reference and match to the sketch on the template worksheet.

STEP 6: Take photos of all your template pieces while still in place on the deck. These will be useful for our design team to understand how everything fits together. Take these pictures from far enough away that you can see a good portion of the boat.

STEP 7: Complete the template worksheet and fill in all possible information. This will help our designers to create the best fitting kit the first time.

STEP 8: Email all your pictures to info@marinemat.net and package your template kit for return to MarineMat. Once we receive your pattern we will get it scanned into our system. One of our representatives will contact you for the next steps.
