- STEP 1: Cut the MarineMat-supplied templating material to the rough shape and size of each area to be covered. Note: Keep in mind that the largest piece of MarineMat decking cannot exceed 88"X44" without a seam. If choosing brushed material the brush grain runs the 88"direction.
- STEP 2: Once your MarineMat-supplied templating material is cut, use masking tape or painter's tape (NOT PROVIDED) to hold it in place and pull it flat.

STEP 3: Using the supplied permanent marker, trace the outline of where you want the mats to fit. Unless otherwise noted, we will presume matching radius, cutouts, lines, etc.

Borders on adjacent pieces should be intentionally aligned.

- NOTE: It is advisable to keep the mats 1"- 2" away from vertical walls, especially in tight corners. Where possible, try to have the edge of the mats extend beyond the non-skid and onto the smooth part of the deck. Around hinges, latches, seat bases, table bases, leaning posts, T-tops, access ports or other deck obstructions, make sure to leave a minimum of 1/4"-1/2" clearance on all sides. For all openings make sure to have the pattern recessed back from the edge a minimum of 1/4".
- STEP 4: Mark the orientation of each piece indicating "Bow", "Stern", "Port", and "Starboard". Using the included ruler, draw two parallel lines from each piece to the adjoining piece. Using a lettering system, mark both pieces as a reference (e.g. A/A, B/B and so on). This is a necessary step for the designers to rebuild your template and ensures all pieces are aligned properly. Mark each piece of the kit with a unique number (1,2,3 etc.). Make notes anywhere that may not clear how the templated pieces look, so as to avoid any confusion of the type of line or curve that are on the templates.
- STEP 5: Take photos of all your template pieces before removing them. Please note we will not be able to move forward with your design unless we have these photos. These will be a critical step for our design team to understand how everything fits together. The wider the angle of the images to fully capture the position of the template, the better.
- STEP 6: Complete the template worksheet and fill in all possible information.
